Washington Construction Co. acquires Morrison Knudsen, a designer and contractor of major infrastructure throughout the world and one of the consortium of firms that built Hoover Dam, the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge, the NASA Vehicle Assembly Building, the Trans-Alaska Pipeline, and many other large, U.S. infrastructure projects.

Washington Group is acquired by URS for \$2.6 billion.



2010

Shimmick wins a \$140 million contract to construction the San Vicente Dam Raise, the tallest dam raise in the U.S. Shimmick continues to win additional major projects, including the \$897M BART Extension to San Jose.



#### 2012

Shimmick starts a foundation group to perform work throughout the western United States and Hawaii. This work includes some of the most technical and challenging largediameter drilled-shaft foundation projects in the U.S.



Shimmick company Rust Constructors continues work at Black Thunder Mine to build infrastructure for the largest open pit coal mine in North America. Our work at Black Thunder dates back to 1993, when Washington Group International acquired Fuller Construction.
